

WAYS INDIANA CONSUMERS GET HURT

UNDER LATEST WINERY LEGISLATIVE PROPOSAL

1. **CONVENIENCE TAKEN AWAY:** Indiana consumers (in 6-12 months) will no longer be able to purchase 2/3 of Indiana-produced wine for direct shipment to their homes or businesses.
2. **INVASION OF PRIVACY:** Indiana consumers can't buy Indiana wine in a tasting room or have it direct shipped to their home or business without signing an affidavit under penalties of perjury that they haven't been convicted of an alcohol crime within the last 10 years (this includes convicted of using a fake ID).
3. **FREEDOM TO CHOOSE:** Indiana consumers will not be able to obtain direct shipments of wine from Indiana's larger wineries once larger wineries reach cap. But if an Indiana consumer moves to Illinois, Michigan, Ohio or 29 other states they could receive shipments from any Indiana winery, not just the smaller wineries.
4. **THREAT OF FELONY:** Indiana consumers are threatened with a Class D felony (up to 3 years in prison and up to \$10,000 fine) if they knowingly or intentionally do all of the following within 10 years:
 - A. Use a fake ID in the tasting room or upon delivery;
 - B. Receive more than a total of 24 cases of wine from all wineries in Indiana or the U.S. in one year;
 - C. Represent in the affidavit that they are an Indiana resident when they are not.

WAYS INDIANA WINERIES GET HURT

UNDER LATEST WINERY LEGISLATIVE PROPOSAL

1. **PUNISHES INDIANA WINERIES FOR PROSPERING AND GROWING:** If Indiana wineries get too big, they can no longer:
 - A. Sell in tasting rooms (unless an exception is made for vintners);
 - B. Ship Indiana wine to consumers located in Indiana;
 - C. Sell specialty wines directly to retailers when wholesalers aren't interested in distributing.
2. **THREAT OF FELONY:** Indiana wineries are threatened with a Class D felony if they knowingly or intentionally do all of following within 10 years:
 - A. Fail to cause a UPS or Fed Ex carrier to card at the door;
 - B. Ship over 24 cases to one consumer or more than 3000 to all consumers within one year;
 - C. Sell wine in the tasting room or ship wine without a consumer affidavit.
